

## *“the circuit, the skull, the wheel, the whirlwind”!*

These are all alternate meanings of the word “commit” in Ps.37:5. “Commit your way to the Lord, trust also in Him and he shall bring it to pass.”

When you commit something you are releasing it into the hands of another for safe keeping. It even has the idea of a camel loaded, kneels down and tilts the load off. This in itself is a great picture of what God wants us all to do daily. Our prayer is just for that purpose.

Accumulated needs pile up unknowingly during the day, but prayer unloads the whole thing and experiences peace and rest. Jesus knew this in saying, “come unto me all you who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest.” Roll your burdens over on me I will carry them!!

However, the alternate meanings of commit give the greatest insight. The circuit, the skull, wheel and whirlwind all are little nuggets of truth that speak such a powerful message. The circuit speaks of closing off the mind entirely to damaging, doubting, and unfaithful thoughts. You can't guard your thought life on Sundays,

or when it occurs to you. God wants every thought cast down! When you complete the circuit the power will flow. Electricity has power in your house because it completes a circuit. God doesn't want any breaks in your thought life.

The skull: is where the commit takes place, the whole battle is over thoughts. Jesus died on a hill called “the skull”. To me it means he conquered that hill with all its savage attacks because he never allowed the enemy inside his skull.

The wheel: when you commit yourself letting go of your own ways and thoughts, God can really take you somewhere. Face it we are stuck, not because of our problems but because we think the same way about our problems. I am determined in this new year to change my thinking. If nothing changes outwardly, it's o.k. because I am going to change inwardly.

The whirlwind: testing is going to come. The things you have committed will become a test. But it's not about Satan; it's about God seeing if you really mean it. It's like our money when we take it to the bank and deposit it. You have to let go of it before the teller can put it in safekeeping for you. You have to trust the bank with it in order to let go of it. Sometimes in some

things we won't let go because we simply don't trust God to take care of it. Believe me God is a much safer place than your bank!

God help us in this new year to grow, to become more by letting go more! Worry is sin! It is sin because we won't let go. It's about control. We are afraid God won't make it turn out the way we want it to. If that is your worry, then you never let go of it. Trust God that things will turn out the way they are supposed to, not the way you want them to! There is a big difference.
